

#### **KEY FACTS**

- Support for "cross-sector" work in the arts
- •Funding focus on collaborative projects that bring together the arts with other sectors to promote positive social change
- Funding is available to projects across the state of CO



#### **KEY FACTS**

- •Granted projects must be completed within 24 months of funding- your project timeline can range anywhere from a few months to 24 months
- •21-22 grantees per year with an average grant size of \$24,000



#### AiS Support

- •Financial support- grants range between \$5,000-\$35,000 and do NOT require matching support
- Learning Community Meetings
- Evaluation Support
- Marketing and Communications
- Mini-Documentaries



### Eligibility

- Open to nonprofits and individuals. You do NOT need to be an arts organization. We encourage applications from non-arts organizations like human service groups, neighborhood organizations or healthcare organizations (as examples).
- Primary applicants must be from Colorado. If you are an organization or artist outside the state of Colorado interested in applying, you must partner with an organization within the state in order to be eligible. A fiscal sponsor does not count as a "partner". Partner organizations must play a critical role in the implementation of the project.
- Organizations, individuals, schools, and government agencies are all eligible to apply.



### Eligibility

- We specifically look for projects that demonstrate a high level of collaboration between artists, organizations, and a target community to address a problem or social justice issue.
- Previous grantees ARE eligible to apply.
- If you are a previous grantee, you must be current on your grant reports to apply again for funding.
- You will not receive overlapping funding for the same project.



### Application Process

- In 2023 Arts in Society will be returning to a two-step application process.
- Applicants will first submit a Letter of Intent (LOI) outlining their vision for an Arts in Society project.
- After panel review, selected applicants will be asked to submit a detailed proposal before final funding decisions are made.

### Application Process

- Application process
  - The review panel changes every year and represents a diverse community of experts in the arts and human services fields. Funding partners also participate on the panel and review process
  - Grantees are will be notified and funds will be dispersed in March 2024 and will be formally announced in April 2024



## Application Considerations

- Be realistic in your budget and account for ALL costs related to your project.
- Consider the cost of learning community related travel when building your budget.
- Remember to allocate funds for artists and admin.
- Allow your budget to tell the story of your project
- A budget is NOT required for the LOI but will be part of the proposal round



## Application Considerations

- Be specific in what your project activities will be.
- •Be specific about who your community is, or communities are.
- •Is this FOR or WITH?
- You do not need to have partnerships finalized, but you should be able to demonstrate that you know the field and how you will form partnerships




# Examples of Funded Projects

## *The Clinic,* Tara Rynders Denver, CO

Purpose: To bring a new culture of cure to Rose Medical Center through movement classes, dance, films, and performance

- A multi-faceted program addressing compassion fatigue and nurse burnout
- "First, Do No Harm" performed in the hospital fall of 2018
- Ongoing movement and dance performances and workshops with Rose nurses and patients
- Tara has subsequently received the Colorado Nurses Foundation's Nightingale Luminary Award and is a 2019 A Blade of Grass Fellow
- Resiliency Moments Workshops created in response to pandemic
